



## Bibliometric Analysis of Aesthetic Education (2013-2023): Research Status, Hotspots and Trends

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**Abstract:** This paper presents a comprehensive analysis of aesthetic education based on the Web of Science platform, focusing on research status, hotspots, and trends. Utilizing COOC13.5 bibliometric analysis, literature spanning between 2013 and 2023 is quantitatively evaluated to uncover interdisciplinary trends and geographical impacts. The analysis reveals the significant developments of aesthetic education, particularly in education policy, teaching methodologies, interdisciplinary collaboration, and technological integration. Based on these insights, the discussion centers on the strategies of enhancing aesthetic education, including strengthening policy frameworks, fostering innovative teaching approaches, promoting interdisciplinary collaboration, and leveraging technology for educational purposes. This study provides valuable insights for policymakers, educators, and researchers seeking to advance aesthetic education.

Therefore, a study on the development and implementation of aesthetic education holds significant value in enhancing and advancing aesthetic education. Thus, this paper focuses on the status, hotspots and trends of aesthetic education from the year of 2013 to 2023.

Additionally, the analysis of geographical distribution of institutions highlighted the key activity areas within aesthetic education research. 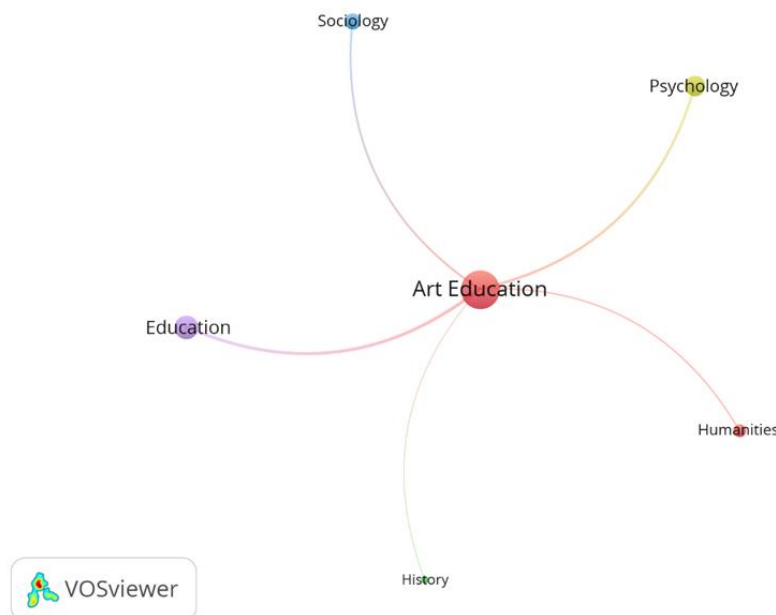


Figure 1: The Disciplinary Network Chart

### 3.2 Geographical Distribution

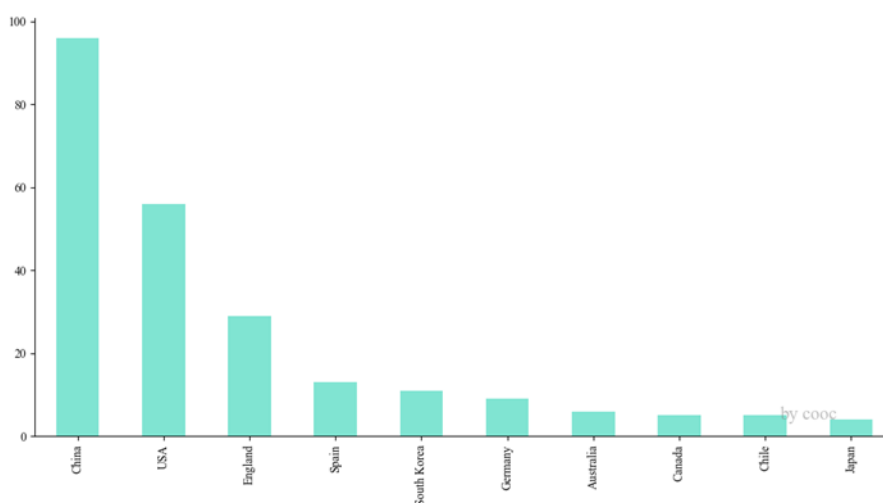


Figure 2: The Geographical Distribution Chart

### 3.3 Research Hotspots

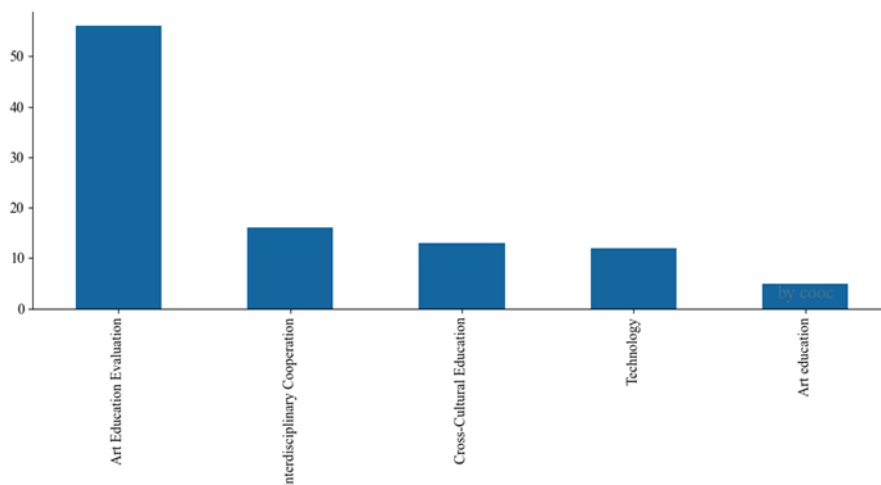


Figure 3: The Keyword Co-occurrence Chart

We have studied in depth the research hotspots, disciplinary intersections, and geographical distribution of aesthetic education by using the Web of Science platform to collect relevant literature from 2013 to 2023 and using COOC13.5 software to conduct bibliometric analysis.

The results of the study indicate that research on aesthetic education is characterized by interdisciplinarity and has yielded significant influence particularly in countries like the United States, Britain, Germany, and some Asian regions. The analysis of the development trend of aesthetic education reveals that current research priorities include the support and innovation of educational policies, the advancement of teaching methods and

contents, fostering interdisciplinary collaboration, and the integration of technology.

To facilitate the advancement of aesthetic education, several suggestions are proposed: to enhance policy support and management by formulating clearer policies and guiding documents for aesthetic education; to optimize teaching methods and contents with an emphasis on nurturing students' creative thinking and artistic expression; to enhance the competency of teaching staff through professional training and development; to promote interdisciplinary cooperation for the integration of art education with other disciplines; and leverage technological applications to innovate approaches to aesthetic education.

In summary, aesthetic education plays a crucial role in fostering creative thinking and is intertwined with economic development and scientific and technological innovation. By analyzing the research hotspots and development trends of aesthetic education, a series of strategies and recommendations for advancing aesthetic education have been proposed. Nonetheless, the study has limitations such as restricted data sources and research methodologies. Future research directions could delve into exploring the implementation outcomes of aesthetic education, the development of teacher training models, and the establishment of an evaluation system to propel the holistic growth of aesthetic education.

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
